## MANAGING PURPLE MASH

Alerts: I can imagine that sometimes the amount of alerts is overwhelming! However, you do not need to open every alert!

If you have a message saying 'New Comment Has Been posted" – just click on the x at the top right of the message box and it will delete it. (Don't worry, it only deletes the alert, not the post.)

You only need to open the 2Dos or the messages that notify you that a comment has been added to your work.

**Folders:** As the amount of work submitted builds up, it will become increasingly important to manage your folder. I would suggest adding folders for each subject that you do. Also, try to name your piece of work clearly e.g. English task 2 22.4.

Your folders can be accessed by your teachers – and we check them regularly so we can comment on new work (please ensure all content is appropriate and relates to learning). They may help you by making new folders (so don't be alarmed if you notice some changes!)
