## Letter formation and handwriting

Ones to watch out for! Children often get stuck on the letters with the c shape in them e.g. a, d, g, e. Make sure they start in the correct place and go in the right direction. Another common error is the letter $b$ which children can write like the number six. See below for the correct way. Children can also get muddled with the letter p by starting at the bottom. It's important that they start from the top.

Encourage children to add 'flicks' at the end of the letters $a, d, h, i, k, I, m, n, t$ and $u$.


The dots indicate where the children should start the letter and the arrows show which direction they should go in.
