Hello, my name is Kathryn Saunderson and I am the new Deputy Head at Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School. I joined the school in January, just in time for the snow and ice but thankfully the welcome I have received from the school community has been much warmer and friendlier!

Before I joined Surrey Hills All Saints Primary School, I had worked as Assistant Head across an infant and junior school in Horsham for just over seven years. I have been able to meet some of you in person on the gate at the beginning or end of the day but I know there are many more of you to still get to meet and know. I split my week between Surrey Hills All Saints and St Johns in the same way as Mrs Fyson but am always available by via email if you have any questions or queries <u>ksaunderson@surreyhills.surrey.sch.uk</u>.



Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/ children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/ children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

#### **Reception Bees Class**

Bees have been learning all about special places. One of their special places is a church and they have been learning all about events that take place in a church.

This week their focus has been on weddings. The children spent a lovely afternoon designing wedding hats, colouring doilies for the wedding cake competition and making beautiful bouquets for the wedding party.
