Reading – Children should read every day. Reading should be recorded in the reading record (this can be a comment or simply a signature to indicate that home reading has taken place). (Year 6 children will have a diary to record.)

Homework – set on a Friday, return on the following Wednesday (two pieces of homework). A maximum of 45 minutes per subject is expected. If your child does not complete his/her work within this time, or finds it extremely challenging, do write a short note to advise of any issues.

Spellings – A list of common exception words will be sent home each half term. These are for the children to learn at home, and there will be a spelling test at the end of each half term.
