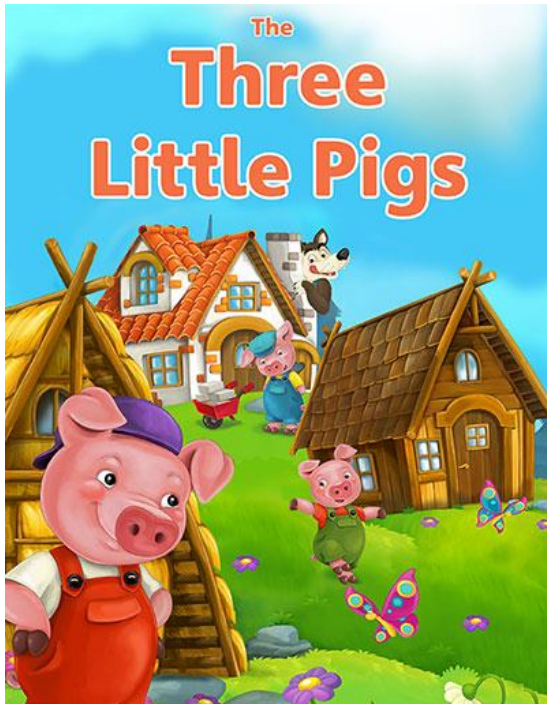


Hello Bees!

This week's story!




The three little pigs used different building materials to make their houses and try to protect themselves from the wolf. Have a go at junk modelling or using your toys to make a little house for the pigs. What could you use to make it really strong? What if it rains ... would your little house be waterproof? Remember the design process to improve your little pig houses!




We are revising all our digraphs and trigraphs this week. Remember these are one sound made by using more than one letter. Here are some ...

Can you spot these words when you are reading, listening to and looking at stories? Can you read them? Can you write them in a sentence? 

Marvellous Maths! This week we are measuring ... we can measure so many things. Can you measure the length of a book using cubes or pennies? Now try using a tape measure or ruler. Get a grown up to show you the units of measurement - millimetres, centimetres and metres! (don't worry about the inches!) 



A standard ruler is usually 30cm long 



Collect 20 things that are less than 30cm. Can you place them in order from smallest to biggest? Ask a grown up to help you measure how long the smallest is and how long the biggest is??



Learning to trust people is really important but we also need to remember that we can't trust all people all of the time so we need to think. Would you trust the Wolf in the story? Would you trust the Three Little Pigs in the story? Why do you think the Wolf behaved like he did? How would you have dealt with the Wolf in this story?

PIGGY FACTS



- *A Pig house is called a Sty. 
- *Pigs are extraordinarily intelligent - scientists say they are smarter than dogs.
- *Pigs snuggle close to one another and prefer to sleep nose to nose.
- *Newborn piglets run to their mothers' voices and recognise their own names.
- *Mother pigs sing to their young while nursing. 
- *Pigs do not "eat like pigs" or "pig out." They prefer to eat slowly and savour their food.
- *Pigs are very clean animals.
- *Pigs don't "sweat like pigs"; because they are actually unable to sweat.
- *They like to bathe in water or mud to keep cool (they prefer water).
