Notes to Parents and Reminders:

There will be much for parents, staff and children alike to learn in this first half term especially in the light of our 'new normal'. If you have any questions please come and see us or email the office, no matter how small or insignificant you think they might be.

Thank you for your support with your child's learning. Please keep in mind that children make most progress when reading daily. So please ensure you read with your child, even if its comics, favourite stories etc...

We will be holding a remote 'meet the teacher' meeting on 14th October for parents. This is to help you understand how the children learn in school and how you can support this at home. We will also be talking about the process of learning to read. **After that** your child will receive reading books every Monday which will then need to be returned on a Thursday so they can be quarantined in school over the weekend.

Please remember that Wednesday is our **Forest School** session. The children are required to attend school in their own clothes for these days. They will require hats, coats, gloves, waterproofs, wellies etc... depending on the weather. They will also need a change of shoes for their time spent back inside the classroom. It is most useful for children to keep a pair of wellington boots in school so that they can use these during lunch and playtimes if they wish to go onto the field.
